The Chamber,

Given that:

Article 3 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights affirms the right to life of every human being;

Article 6, Paragraph 1 of the International Agreement on Civil and Political Rights, adopted by UN General Assembly on 16 December 1966 and came into force on 23 March 1976, provides that the right to life is inherent to the human person. This right shall be protected by law and no one can be arbitrarily deprived of life;

in accordance with Article 6 of the Convention on the Rights of the Child, the States Parties recognize that every child has the inherent right to life and ensure to the maximum extent possible the survival and development of the child

Article 1 of Law n.194 of 1978 states that "the voluntary termination of pregnancy under this Act, is not a measure of birth control"

the spread in the world of sex selective abortion which harms prevalently **female conceived** ("concepito di sesso femminile") is causing in some geographic areas a serious imbalance between the sexes;

is increasing the number of foreign laws that actively promote abortion as a means of population control and policies that target with sanctions of various kinds, women who reject abortion;

binds the government:

to promote the drafting and approval of a United Nations resolution condemning the use of abortion as an instrument of demographic control and affirms the right of every woman not to be forced to undergo abortion.
